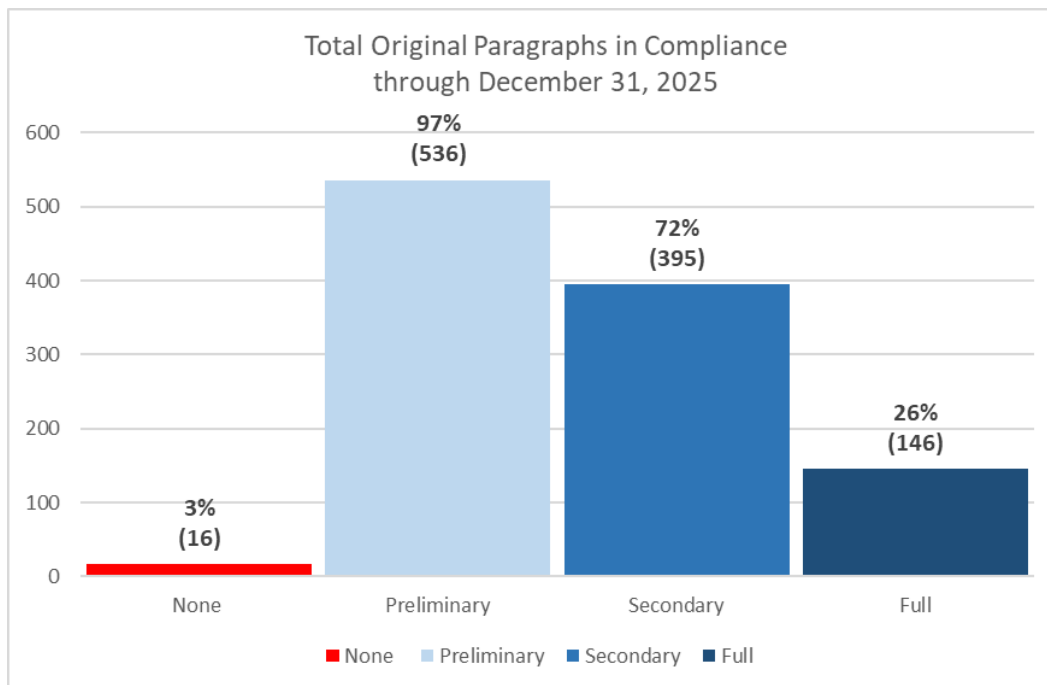

**Monitor Hickey Files *Independent Monitoring Report 13*,
*Highlighting Recent Compliance Progress and the Steps Ahead***

CHICAGO – Independent Monitor Maggie Hickey filed [Independent Monitoring Report 13](#) with Judge Rebecca R. Pallmeyer in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois. The report is an update to the Court and the public on the City of Chicago’s and the Chicago Police Department’s compliance progress through the thirteenth reporting period (July 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025).

Monitor Hickey said, *“The City and the CPD continue to make meaningful progress toward compliance while advancing efforts to build and rebuild trust in Chicago’s communities. Central to that work is the CPD’s growing ability to incorporate community perspectives into the development and delivery of training.”*

For the original monitorable paragraphs (552), the City has now achieved at least Preliminary compliance with 536 paragraphs (or about 97%), at least Secondary compliance with 395 paragraphs (or about 72%), and Full compliance with about 146 paragraphs (or about 26%)—leaving 16 paragraphs with no levels of compliance (or about 3%). In addition to paragraphs where the City and the CPD maintained compliance, the City gained additional levels of compliance in the thirteenth reporting period with about 60 of these paragraphs—or about 11% of the original monitorable paragraphs—including 13 paragraphs that moved into Preliminary compliance, 29 paragraphs that moved into Secondary compliance, and 18 paragraphs that moved into Full compliance.



Monitor Hickey added, *“The City and the CPD are positioned for continued progress in 2026 but sustaining that progress will require aligning staffing and resources with community needs and demonstrating an ability to transparently self-evaluate and adjust course when needed. We hope that the recent workforce allocation study can serve as a guide for the City and the CPD.”*
